
WHO WE ARE?


SURVEY RESULTS

Which category best describes the sector in which you work?






Personally, how concerned are you about climate change?






How often does concern about climate change influence how you approach your projects?






How informed do you feel about the impact of landscape architecture construction on climate change?

SUMMARY OF RESULTS

The majority of the respondents are very concerned about climate change, yet many do not feel equipped with the tools and knowledge to implement climate positive designs. There is a disconnect between being informed vs feeling capable to enact change.

Respondents are looking for specific and actionable resources to implement in their practice. If available information is broad it makes it difficult to understand how to implement it.



SUMMARY OF RESULTS

Many "best practices" in our profession overlap with climate positive strategies and are already being implemented frequently by practitioners, even those who are not concerned about climate change. Those strategies include utilizing native vegetation, green stormwater infrastructure, habitat features, maximizing future tree canopy and local materials within our work.
